September 20 Anna Greenberg Update on the 2020 Elections

Anna Greenberg, a Machar member and a managing partner of GQR, a company specializing in polling and opinion research, will provide a deeply informed view of the upcoming elections. GQR has been at the center of many important progressive victories - the election of Bill Clinton in 1992, Mandala's electoral victory in 1994, and the Nobel-prize winning International Campaign to Ban Landmines. With a Ph.D. in political science from the University of Chicago, Anna has over 20 years of experience polling in political, non-profit, and academic sectors.

October 18 Ittay Flescher Israelis, Palestinians, and an Interfaith Youth Movement in East Jerusalem

How can working with the next generation help resolve the Israeli/Palestinian conflict? Ittay Flescher will share his reflections about the complex identities of Jewish, Muslim, and Christian residents of Jerusalem through his experience as the Education Director at Kids4Peace. During the session, there will be opportunities to experience parts of programs run for the youth and ask questions about the benefits and challenges of cross-border contact between cultures and societies whose people are in conflict.
